This term's topic in Year 1 'Explorers'. If you have any artefacts or books or photographs please send them in, so that your child can share them with their class.

In Phonics we will be covering the following /phonemes/ and graphemes:

English

In English, our focus text will be *The Storm Whale* by Benji Davies. We will start by using key events (plot points) in the story to collate adventurous vocabulary, to write and develop a range of sentences (sentence stacking). We will then move on to getting to know the story and retelling it through role play, before the independent writing stage.

Maths

Our maths learning this half term includes:

Numbers 0-20 - Representing and comparing numbers from 0 to 20, identifying odd and even numbers between 0-20 and adding and subtracting numbers to 20. Time - Telling the time on the hour (o'clock) and half hour(half past), writing time and comparing time using vocabulary such as 'before' and 'after'. Money - Recognising coins and notes and adding up coins.

Multiplication - Counting in 2s, 5s, 10s and making arrays

Division - by grouping and sharing

Fractions - Halve's and quarters of shapes and numbers.

Science

In science we will be learning about the life cycle of a plant. The children will have the opportunity to grow their own plant and record each stage of growth.

Other Curriculum Areas

HISTORY

This term's topic is 'Explorers' and will be looking at different explorers throughout history. We will be researching facts about a range of explorers including: Mae Jemison, Amy Johnson, Matt Henson, Ranulph Fiennes and Christopher Columbus. Whilst learning about Christopher Columbus, we will be touching on slavery. You might like to use this as moment to discuss identity, race and discrimination with your child.

PSHE

This half-term's PSHE unit is focused around touch including appropriate touch and consent. We will also revisit the PANTS rule (https://www.nspcc.org.uk/keeping-children-safe/support-for-parents/pants-underwear-rule/
