### Our Learning Journey

The highlight of last half-term's India topic proved to be the International Evening - so lovely to see so many of you at the India stall and many thanks for your contributions!

As you will see above, Year 3 will be performing an assembly to parents (or grandparents etc if you can't be there), which will be based on our learning about India. It will be in the hall and we expect it to run for approximately 20 minutes. Please come if you can!

### Anglo Saxons

This half term our topic is the Anglo Saxons. Clearly this has a history focus! Our key line of enquiry links to the Sutton Hoo treasure and what archaeologists have been able to deduce from the finds within the burial site.

### Science

The focus is on magnets and forces, which has lots of practical investigations

### English

#### Reading

Our whole class reading book this half term is Planet Omar, Accidental Trouble Magnet by Zanib Mian, featuring a Muslim boy with a huge imagination.

#### Writing

The key focus will be on using suspense in writing. This narrative unit will be based around 'Wolves in the Walls' by Neil Gaiman and excerpts from the first Toy Story film. The children will draw on previous learning, including similes and metaphors, alliteration, dialogue, as well as exploring short, sharp sentences and repetition for dramatic effect.

### Maths

Our maths learning this half term includes:

#### Measurement

- Fractions
- Time
- Properties of Shape
- Mass (kg/g) and Volume/capacity (l/ml)

Our times tables fluency focus will be revision of the tables focused on this year (3x, 4x, 6x, 8x, 12x).

Your child's maths home learning will continue to provide a window into the detail of the aspects and methods covered in lessons.
