As the children enter their final few weeks in Year 4, we look forward to more exciting learning opportunities.

Next week, the children will sit the Year 4 times tables check. This will take place in the computer suite and will involve them answering 25 times table questions (up to x12) with a maximum of 6 seconds perquestion. The children have already had a practise this week, so they are familiar with the format.

Our Learning Journey: 'Storytellers'

This half term's topic is Storytellers and we will be exploring storytelling across the curriculum. In History, we will be studying the Ancient Maya and the stories they told.

## English:

# Reading and Spelling:

In Reading, we be starting our new novel, 'The Invention of Hugo Cabret' by Brian Selznick. We continue to encourage the children to read for pleasure every day.

Our first spelling focus this half term is words that contain the letter 'c' to make a 's' sound, e.g. celery, celebrate. This rule usually applies when the letter 'c' is followed by an 'e' or an 'i'. Our spelling focus will then move back to 'homophones' for the rest of the term.

Lists of the spellings can be found in Google Classroom, and in the children's spelling books

#### Writing:

This half term, we will be using a brand-new scheme for writing: The Write Stuff. In our first unit, the children will be using the famous story of Charlie and the Chocolate Factory as a stimulus for their own writing.

### Maths:

- Decimals Recognising and representing tenths and hundredths, exploring dividing by 10 and 100
- Measure Length and perimeter converting mm, cm m
- Properties of shape triangles, quadrilaterals and key vocabulary

## Science:

This half-term, we will be learning about 'sound' and how vibrations travel from a medium to our ear. We will also be exploring patterns between the volume of a sound and the strength of the vibrations that produced it.

# Oracy:

Oracy returns this half-term with the focus being a piece of <u>fictional</u> text. We will share more details in Google Classroom over the next couple of weeks.
