Sports Leaders

10 girls and boys will be selected from Years 6 to be Sports Leaders. A number of these children are in receipt of Pupil Premium funding. Their duties include:

- Helping with sport clubs
- Supporting younger children
- Writing match reports
- Keeping the equipment cupboard in order
- Leading/setting up activities at lunchtimes including zoning of the playground

Extra Curricular Activities:

Since September 2013, there has been a vast improvement in the quantity and quality of extra curricular provision. A senior teacher leads the organisation of all extra-curricular activities to ensure that over the academic year, each child has the opportunity (where possible) to attend at least one extra curricular activity. Some of the sporting provision includes: football, basketball, karate, netball, multi-sports, street dance, hockey, and skateboarding.

A teacher with a sports degree will continue to provide CPD going forward.

Provision will continue to develop with a new leader in place from September. Plus teachers with specialist skills taking clubs after school.
