Surprising but True

Did you know that the first ever Summer Olympic Games to be held across two countries were the 1920 Summer Olympics which took place in Belgium and the Netherlands?

In 1956, host nation Australia were unable to hold the equestrian events due to strict quarantine laws, so these events had to be held in Stockholm, five months earlier.

Even more Surprising but True

Did you know that 43 different teams have won English football's FA Cup competition since it was first held in 1872? Currently, Arsenal have won the competition on most occasions (14 times) with Manchester United a close second (12).

Portsmouth hold the record for the most years in possession of the cup (7 years). However, this was due to the fact that the competition was postponed for 7 years when World War II broke out.
