Eco School Team attend the Lewisham Big Schools' Climate Event

Last Tuesday, Years 4, 5, and 6 Eco School team went to the Horniman museum for the Lewisham Big Schools Climate Event.



We had a tour of the aquarium and saw lots of incredible sea creatures. A member of staff, taught us facts about the sea life and gave us a behind the scenes look at the aquarium. He took out a toad to show us and we also held baby jellyfish in a tiny tube.

They control the lighting in the tanks so that the coral doesn't bleach. When coral gets too much light, they lose their algae and they can only survive for 3-4 days without it. Sadly, this is what global warming is doing to coral reefs across the world.



Behind one tank, they are growing a plant using the fish faeces as food. This plant is called a Luffa and when dried and peeled it can be used

to scrub and wash. They are growing an ecofriendly way to clean their tanks! We also went to a workshop about air quality. The team had put up diffusion tubes, which collect nitrogen dioxide, around the museum, so that we could see what areas had the most nitrogen dioxide. Obviously, the tube from the main road had collected harmful amounts of nitrogen dioxide.

In the afternoon, we took part in a Dragon's Den competition with ten other schools. Our team proposed that we should recycle glue sticks at school because at the moment they just go into landfill. We asked the Dragons to help us buy a Terracycle Zero Waste Box to collect glue sticks and then they can be recycled. We've already collected a lot of glue sticks to put in the box.

The judges (Councillor Chris Barnham, Councillor Louise Krupski and the Young Mayor of Lewisham) were





really impressed with our presentation. After a bit of discussion, they offered us the £500 and we also agreed to recycle more things at school including crisp packets. We will be sending out more information about this project very soon.
